Welcome back to school!

What a fabulous week we have had welcoming our new receptions to school. It was also fantastic to welcome many new students into other classes across our year 1-6 classes. News is clearly getting out how fantastic our school community is and the environment that we are so proud of.

As many of you would be aware, we have started the year with a new logo. This was only approved in December last year. Over the break, we have worked really hard with our designers, Design Notion, to roll out the new brand. This does take time. 
This year we have an incredibly talented team:
