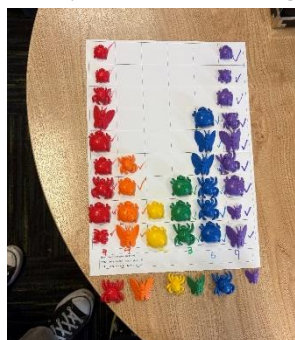
Aren't they cute?

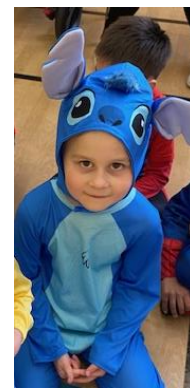
UNIFORMS HAVE ARRIVED!
