MATHEMATICS IN RM 8!

Year 5/6 with Leah Katavatis

This term in Room 8, we've been learning all about Patterns and Algebra. We've been using BIDMAS – Brackets, Indices, Division, Multiplication, Addition and Subtraction to help us build and solve number sentences.

We've also been using multiplication, division, addition and subtraction to work out different rules in number patterns. One of our favourite activities was using different objects to make growing patterns. Then we rotated around the room and tried to figure out each other's rules. It was fun to test our problem solving skills and explain our thinking to our classmates!


We've also started learning about algebraic expressions and how to use letters to represent numbers. It was a bit tricky at first, but now we're getting the hang of writing and solving expressions using symbols like **n**, **x** and **y**. Algebra is helping us understand how to describe patterns in a smarter way!

Wishing those who celebrate, a wonderful Rakhi!




UNIFORM SALE














MARK OLIPHANT SCIENCE COMP
